Upon returning to Canada, remained in Toronto and worked in various parishes, including The Newman Centre Catholic Mission at U of T. Current Pastor of Holy Rosary Parish. He is a Benedictine Oblate novice with Saint Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, Pennsylvania.

These uncertain Covid times have shone a light on the pressing need for mental health support services. St. Peter's Parish and Dr. Egit have teamed up in addressing that need.
